
Diary of a Christmas Elf by Ben Miller




The Butterfly Lion (illustrated edition) by Michael Morpurgo

Living in disguise, Reya's sole focus is protecting the Bookweaver's secret. When her father is taken, Reya must flee deep into the jungle with her best friend and one ancient book. Grappling with Reya's newfound magic, the two girls find themselves in the center of a war of liberation where magic reigns unchecked, and destiny takes a dark turn. As the stakes get higher, Reya realizes that her father's legacy contains more power than she ever imagined. Soon a new future is beginning to form in Lila's mind, one that would mean leaving everything she ever planned behind.
