

The Guerrilla and the Journalist

Exploring Jonas Savimbi's Murderous Legacy



As a young Reuters correspondent, Bridgland revealed the secret invasion in 1975 of post-independence Angola by apartheid South Africa's armed forces in support of UNITA rebel leader, Jonas Savimbi. At the time, Bidgland befriended Tito Chingunji, a guerrilla officer, before he became UNITA foreign secretary, who persuaded Bridgland to walk hundreds of kilometres across Angola to watch UNITA's fighters go into combat.

Later, Chingunji and Bridgland worked together on a sympathetic biography of the charismatic Savimbi – then the great hope of the 'free West'. However, after the book's publication, Chingunji's family were under constant threat of death from Savimbi.

Bridgland started to uncover atrocities that revealed Savimbi not as the champion of his people, but as a murderous tyrant. Chingunji had risked his life to help Bridgland tell the true story of what was going on behind the scenes. When his friend went missing, Bridgland journeyed into the Angolan jungle to plead his friend's case and he, himself, was put before a kangaroo court by an enraged Savimbi.

This is a personal account of the bond that developed between a guerrilla fighter and a journalist, and the terrifying challenges they faced as they revealed Savimbi's true colours.







Due to a high demand for these specialist soldiers at the time, he was part of a group that also did their basic training at the Special Forces.

Each of their courses is described in detail to show the range and the standard of training they received in, among others, weapons handling, bushcraft/survival, demolitions, urban warfare, as well as seaborne and riverine operations.




Raath and a security team were ambushed in May 2004 while on a mission to reconnoitre a power plant south of Baghdad for an American firm. He had been in the country for only two weeks. This was a taste of what was to come over the next few years as he worked as a private military contractor (PMC) in Iraq.

Raath had numerous hair-raising experiences. Key to his survival was his training as a Special Forces operator, or Recce.

General Jan Smuts and his First World War in Africa (1914-1917)

Jan Smuts's abilities as a general have been much denigrated by modern historians. However, he was no armchair soldier – the statesman courageously led his men into battle. During the South African War, he was immersed in the Boer manoeuvre doctrine, which he used to devastating effect in the guerrilla phase of that conflict – leading his commando in a daring invasion of the Cape.

The First World War ushered in a renewed scramble for Africa. Smuts grabbed the opportunity to realise his ambition of a Greater South Africa. He led the southern defensive and was an integral part of the German South West African campaign in 1915. In command of the Allied forces in East Africa in 1916, he led a combination of South Africans and imperial troops against the legendary Paul von Lettow-Vorbeck and his Schutztruppen to great effect. His penchant for manoeuvre warfare remains an enigma.

Katz makes use of multiple archival sources and many of the official accounts of the participants to provide a long-overdue reassessment of Smuts's generalship and his role in furthering the strategic aims of South Africa and the British Empire in Africa during the First World War.


South Africans Versus Rommel

South Africa's Union Defence Force played an important part in World War II and also made tremendous sacrifices. By early 1941 South Africa had 30 000 troops in East Africa, where it helped drive the Italians out of Abyssinia and Somalia. This campaign was mere prelude to the operations it would conduct as part of the British Eighth Army against Erwin Rommel's Afrika Korps in North Africa.


Relying on deep research in South African and British archives, Katz recounts a side of the Desert War that has never received the attention it deserves. It is the story of an army committed somewhat reluctantly to a war it did not fully sup-port, an army ill-prepared for the campaigns it was tasked with waging and forced to learn as it fought, an army committed to battle on the orders of its senior alliance partner. But at its heart this is the story of men at war.


The Nazis' aim was to spread sedition in South Africa and to undermine the Allied war effort. The critical strategic importance of the sea route round the Cape of Good Hope meant that the Germans were also after naval intelligence. Soon U-boat packs were sent to operate in South African waters, to deadly effect.

With the help of the Ossewabrandwag, a network of spies was established to gather important political and military intelligence and relay it back to the Reich. Agents would use a variety of channels to send coded messages to Axis diplomats in neighbouring Mozambique. Meanwhile, police detectives and MI5 agents hunted in vain for illegal wireless transmitters.

Hitler's Spies present an unrivalled account of German intelligence networks that operated in wartime South Africa.


A former South African Air Force pilot who received a Honoris Crux during the Border War and later became a private military contractor, Neall Ellis is one of South Africa's best-known combat aviators. He participated in several major Border War operations, including Operation Protea, Super and Meebos.

Apart from flying Alouette helicopter gunships in Angola, he has fought in the Balkan War (for Islamic forces) and tried to resuscitate Mobutu Sese Seko's ailing air force during his final days ruling the Congo. In war-torn Sierra Leone Ellis played a major role in the fight against the rebel forces of Foday Sankoh. Ellis was also the first private military contractor to work hand-in-glove with British ground and air assets in a modern guerrilla war.

Later in Afghanistan, Ellis flew helicopter support missions for three years where he had more close shaves than in his entire previous four decades put together. The author recounts these hair-raising missions, some of which he accompanied Ellis on as a war correspondent.



Ever since the Border War ended in 1989, the fighting around the dusty town of Cuito Cuanavale has been the subject of a fierce public debate over who won the war. While the leadership of the former South African Defence Force (SADF) claims it was never defeated, the supporters of the Angolan MPLA government, Cuba and SWAPO insist that the SADF was vanquished on the battlefield.

But was Cuito Cuanavale ever really an objective of the SADF? Scholtz tackles this question by examining recently declassified documents in the SANDF archives and exploring the strategic and tactical decisions that shaped the six main battles. His incisive analysis untangles what happens when war, politics and propaganda become entwined.






Charlie Squadron – the iron fist of 61 Mechanised Battalion Group (61 Mech) – led the way on 3 October 1987 during the climactic battle between the South African Defence Force and the Angolan forces on the Lomba River in southern Angola. *Ratels on the Lomba* places the reader in the midst of the squadron of young conscripts who were taken off to the Border War to fight in this battle.

Outnumbered and ill-equipped during the battle on the Lomba, the 47 Brigade of the Angolan forces was nearly wiped out. This blow-by-blow account of a David vs. Goliath battle takes the reader to the heart of the action.

It is honestly told and vividly described, thanks to interviews with veterans and diary entries that help to recreate the drama of the battle. It is also an intensely human story of how individuals react in the face of death and how the war never left them, even when they returned home.





Die Brug tells the stories, in their own voices, of a small band of brothers — young national servicemen of 61 Mechanised Infantry Battalion — who fought in the last and most intense battles around Cuito Cuanavale. Initially they believed they were fighting to defend their country against a total communist onslaught, but later they merely fought to stay alive.

Thirty years after the war they travelled to the wreck of a Ratel in which one of their comrades died. Here many of them opened up for the first time about the gruesome realities of the war and how it affected them.

Growing up in suburban Pretoria, Steve Joubert dreamed of a career as a pilot. After undergoing SAAF pilot training, a freak injury put an end to his hopes of flying fighter jets. Instead he learned to fly the versatile Alouette helicopter.

Joubert had barely qualified as a chopper pilot when he was sent to fly missions in the Border War to supply air cover to troops on the ground. As an Alouette pilot, he saw some of the worst scenes of the war. In this moving memoir he shares some of this experiences and describes how it led him eventually to question his role in the war effort.





From Cabinda in Angola to Dar es Salaam in Tanzania, 4 Reconnaissance Regiment conducted numerous clandestine seaborne raids during the Border War. They attacked strategic targets such as oil facilities, transport infrastructure and even Russian ships. All the while 4 Recce's existence and capability was largely kept secret, even within the South African Defence Force.

With unparalleled access to previously top-secret documents, 50 operations undertaken by 4 Recce, other Special Forces units and the South African Navy are described. The daunting Operation Kerslig (1981), in which an operator died in a raid on a Luanda oil refinery and others were injured, is retold in spinetingling detail.

The book reveals the versatility and effectiveness of this elite unit and also tells of both the successes and failures of its actions. This fascinating work will enthral anyone with an interest in Special Forces operations.


South Africa's POWs in WWII

There are remarkably few publications on South Africa's role in World War II, which had such an influence on how we live today. There is even less written about those who participated on the margins of the war, especially those who were physically removed from the battlefields through capture by enemy forces. South Africa's prisoners of war during World War II, their experiences and recollections, are largely forgotten. That is until now.

Horn painstakingly tracked down a number of former POWs. In their interviews, all the POWs expressed surprise at being asked to share their experiences. Together with written memoirs and archival documents, these interviews reveal rich narratives of hardship, endurance, humour, longing and self-discovery. Instead of fighting, these men adapted to another war, one which was fought on the inside of many prison camps. It was a war against hunger and deprivation, at times against everencroaching despondency and low morale amongst their companions in captivity.

With great insight and empathy, Karen Horn shines a light on a neglected corner of South African history.
