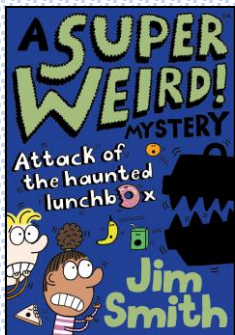
Leo and the Octopus by Isabelle Marinov
