




2023 is around the corner and we're ending the year with a bang! We've got some out of this world fantasy, heartwarming family picture books and stories to enchant all ages.




Bloodmarked by Tracy Deonn




If I Had a Unicorn by Gabby Dawnay & Alex Barrow


Egg Must Hatch by Mariken Jongman & Marieke ten Berge

A quest that is also very amusing, as when a snake would rather swallow the egg whole than hatch it, or a duck turns out to be much too small, or a whale just cannot sit on it, while an elephant could but had better not try, and so on. And as befits a picture book, the end is heart-warming. This book is the first that Jongman and Ten Berge made together, and it instantly makes one long for more.

Welcome, Little One by Sophie Beer








Happy Llamakkah! by Laura Gehl & Lydia Nichols


Grannysaurus by David Walliams

The Unforgettable Logan Foster by Shawn Peters



All the things that made Christmas special are gone: the human connection, the baubles passed down through generations, even the rubbish cracker jokes.










By the Book by Amanda Sellet
