



Risking Life For Death by Ryan Blumenthal 9781776192687 | Jonathan Ball Publishers | PB | R280

With over 20 years' experience, Blumenthal explains how to look for clues and traces, and how what he doesn't find at an autopsy is often more important than what he does find. An understanding of Locard's Exchange Principle can help you become a medical detective in your own life and can help you be a happier person, Blumenthal argues.





The narrator is welcomed by Vardan's family living in exile in a diverse neighbourhood populated by former prisoners, exhausted adventurers and many who have been forcibly uprooted from their homes. Touching anecdotes characterise this text, and powerful memories blending reality and myth are used to recreate a "kingdom of Armenia" that will have a lasting impact upon the author.

But she felt the pull of profit and knew she would do whatever she could, to be successful. Wolf Hustle reveals how Cin ascended from cold caller to stockbroker, a first for a Black woman at her firm. From landing millionaire clients to losing, then gaining back fortunes, Cin examines her time trading, understanding how to build a rich life, and beating Wall Street at its own game.

For centuries, Black women have been removed from the dominant narrative, their stories untold, their art appropriated. Many of them found ways to resist.
