What better way to ease into the colder days than snuggling up with a warm drink and great, cozy read!



In the timeless way that only Katherine Applegate could craft, this highly anticipated novel in verse is the perfect mix of heartfelt and humorous, poignant and sweet.










Minecraft Legends Return Of The Piglins by Matt Forbeck 9780008608804 / Farshore / PB / R220.00

Set over twenty-four hours, Hadley and Oliver's story will make you believe that true love finds you when you're least expecting it.




