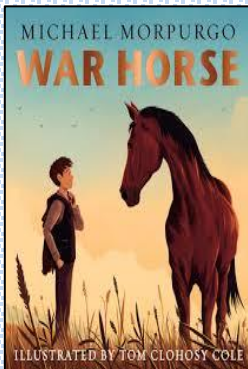

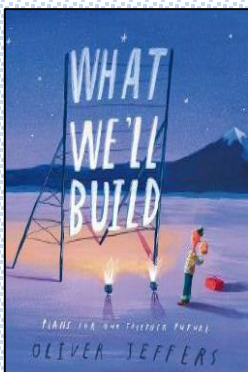
Shine by Jessica Jung

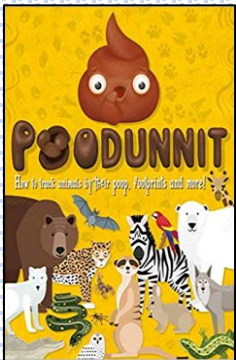

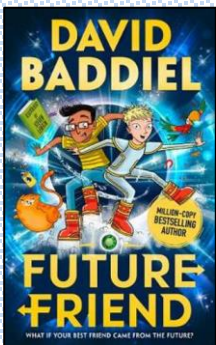

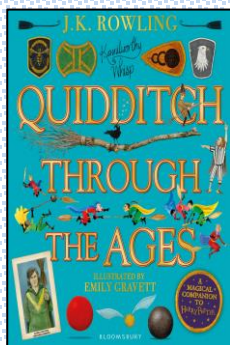


Future Friend by David Baddiel

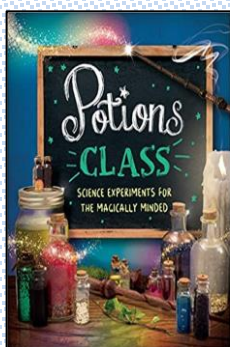

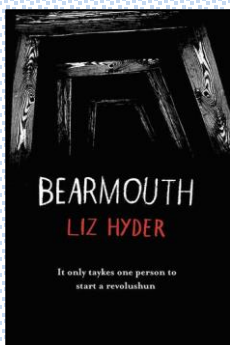
Quidditch Through the Ages by J.K. Rowling

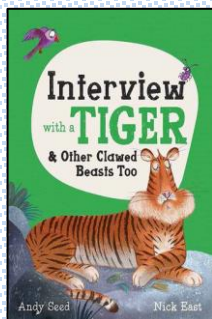
Be Kind, Be Cool, Be You by Nikki Miles

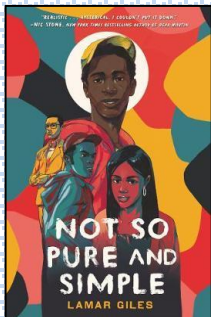

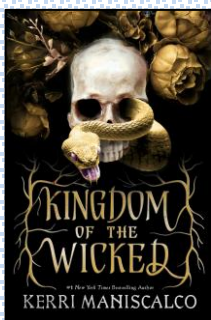

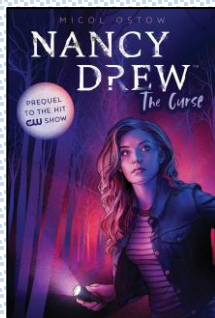
Not so Pure and Simple by Lamar Giles

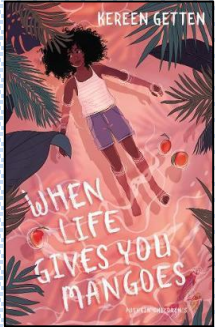
