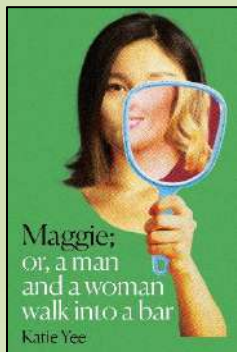
Too much, too fast, too consuming.
